Help is always needed on Wednesday nights. There's a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board downstairs if you're interested.



FEBRUARY MISSION JAMA Food Pantry

The Jonesborough Area Ministerial Association (JAMA) food pantry is an important ministry of JUMC. The pantry is supported primarily by local churches, civic organizations, Walmart, Food City, Ingle's, and food purchased at a greatly reduced rate from the Second Harvest Food Bank. The pantry is located in the Elmer H. Gillespie Building on Persimmon Ridge Road (former home of the Jonesborough Senior Center). Elmer Gillespie has been the dedicated volunteer coordinator of the ministry since 2002.

JUMC has charge of the pantry the first Thursday of every month from 9 am until 12 noon. Food donated by our church is collected and taken to the pantry the first Monday or Tuesday of each month. Recipients must meet financial guidelines as well as the computer check guideline and are able to receive food once every four weeks.
